

Notice of a Data Incident

Minnesota Epilepsy Group, P.A. recently discovered a data incident that may have involved the personal information, including protected health information, for certain individuals. On April 7, 2026, Minnesota Epilepsy Group discovered that an unauthorized third party may have accessed its computer network. Upon discovering the incident, Minnesota Epilepsy Group promptly began an internal investigation, worked to secure its systems, and notified law enforcement. It also engaged a forensic security firm to assist with the investigation and ensure the security of its computer network. The forensic investigation determined that an unauthorized third party accessed Minnesota Epilepsy Group's computer network at times between March 16, 2026, and April 10, 2026, and may have accessed and acquired certain Minnesota Epilepsy Group files during the incident.

Based on the results of its investigation, Minnesota Epilepsy Group analyzed the files potentially accessed or acquired by the unauthorized third party to determine if they contained any personal information. On May 18, 2026, Minnesota Epilepsy Group determined that the files contained personal information of certain individuals. Depending on the individual, the personal information may include their name, address, date of birth, Social Security number, medical treatment information, and/or health insurance information. On June 5, 2026, Minnesota Epilepsy Group began mailing notification letters to those individuals whose information was in the files for whom Minnesota Epilepsy Group has a valid mailing address.

Individuals who receive a notice by mail should refer to that notice regarding steps they can take to protect themselves. Although Minnesota Epilepsy Group has no evidence that any information may have been misused as a result of this incident, as described in those letters, Minnesota Epilepsy Group has arranged for complimentary identity theft protection services for those individuals whose Social Security numbers were involved in the incident. As a precautionary measure, individuals should remain vigilant to protect against potential fraud and/or identity theft by, among other things, reviewing their account statements and monitoring credit reports closely. If individuals detect any suspicious activity on an account, they should promptly notify the financial institution or company with which the account is maintained. They should also promptly report any fraudulent activity or any suspected incidents of identity theft to proper law enforcement authorities, including the police and their state's attorney general. Notified individuals may also wish to review the tips provided by the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") on fraud alerts, security/credit freezes and steps that they can take to avoid identity theft.
